

## Fact Sheet: ACEs Aware in California June 2021 Data Update

The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) and the Office of the California Surgeon General are leading **ACEs Aware** – a first-in-the-nation, statewide effort to screen for Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and treat toxic stress to improve health across the state – now and for generations to come.


ACEs Aware offers Medi-Cal providers training, clinical protocols, and payment for screening children and adults for ACEs.

This fact sheet provides the following information:

- Individuals who have completed the ACEs Aware online training between December 4, 2019, and March 31, 2021.
- Number of ACE screenings conducted in California between January 1, 2020, and September 30, 2020, based on DHCS Medi-Cal claims data.

\*Medi-Cal providers must attest to completing a certified ACEs Aware core training to qualify for Medi-Cal payment.

\*\*ACE score refers to the total reported exposure to the 10 ACE categories. An ACE score of 4 or greater indicates that a patient may be at high-risk for toxic stress.
