May 2024 Data Update


The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) and the Office of the California Surgeon General are leading ACEs Aware, a first-in-the-nation, statewide effort to implement screening for Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and treatment of toxic stress to improve the health and wellbeing of Californians.


ACEs Aware offers clinical teams training, clinical protocols, and payment for screening children, adolescents, and adults for ACEs.

- Number of individuals who completed the ACEs Aware online training between December 4, 2019, and February 29, 2024.
- Number of ACE screenings conducted in California between January 1, 2020, and June 30, 2023, based on DHCS Medi-Cal claims data.

*ACE score refers to the total disclosed exposure to the 10 ACE categories. An ACE score of 4 or greater indicates that patients may be at high risk for toxic stress. Patients with an ACE score of 0 to 3 may also be

at risk for toxic stress.
